A number of us went to Chichester to see one of our Vice-Presidents, Barry Clark, play the Major General in Tarantara's production of *The Pirates of Penzance*. A small cast sang and acted their roles beautifully in an updated production setting the action in 1919 – very reminiscent of "Peaky Blinders"!

In addition to this production of *Pirates*, Pennie went to the revival of Mike Leigh's production of *Pirates* at the ENO featuring G&S stalwarts such as Richard Suart (another of our Vice-Presidents) and John Savournin.

We are also now at the time of year where the annual subscriptions are due for renewal. Thank you to everyone who has already renewed and we hope that the rest of you intend joining us again for another year of G&S-filled entertainment.
