## Melvyn Tarran

On a sunny Sunday afternoon in 2010 Richard and I decided to visit Sheffield Park and after having tea in the café we saw a notice in a small window asking for volunteers to help at a Gilbert & Sullivan Museum, and to call this number. We went home phoned the number and spoke to Melvyn, the following week we started helping out at the museum and this was the beginning of our friendship.

We loved the museum, showing visitors the letters and telegrams from Gilbert to the cast of the D'Oyly Carte opera company and one in particular when he cancelled his dental appointment while suffering badly with toothache. There were magnificent costumes, programmes signed by original cast members of the D'Oyly Carte, the piano that Sullivan had composed some of his music on and the beautiful Grand piano which was a gift to one of his favourite female admirers "so to speak" and so many other treasurers all collected by Melvyn over many years.

It was at the museum that Melvyn and I talked about starting up a G & S Society of Mid Sussex and agreed to contact people that we knew shared our love of Gilbert & Sullivan and so our society was born and is still going strong, however we are now known as the G & S Today Society of Sussex. The Society was originally based at the Birch Hotel in Haywards Heath and Melvyn had to have everything perfect including top class concerts with only the best artistes and an excellent menu for our Annual Luncheon together with entertaining guest speckers.

In 2013 Melvyn sold the building at Sheffield Park and he decided that he should list all of the items he had accumulated over the years in the hope that one day they would be put on show again (which we now hope will happen), his sister Wendy helped him initially to get started, then Melvyn asked us if we would help him on a regular basis as Wendy had returned to France, he said this would only take about 6 months. Well six years later we were still listing things. It was like Aladdin's cave he would open a box and tell us how and when he acquired the items. We also got to touch the items, such as delicate embroidery of Lady Gilbert's handkerchiefs and the programmes that Melvyn had waited patiently outside the theatre in the early years to get autographed. This last year we thought that we had come to the end of the boxes but no, Melvyn would find another one from somewhere and the list went on. It was a great pleasure to work with Melvyn we will miss our weekly visits and most of all we will miss Melvyn and the wealth of knowledge this lovely man had.

It all ended (too soon) with the audience joining in again, this time with part of the finale to Act 1 of The Pirates of Penzance, culminating in a rousing, Hail Poetry. Marvellous! ## Bruce & Caroline Graham: "In Their Own Melodious Way." 3rd July.

To the audience delight, Bruce and Caroline Graham, with William Godfree guiding the proceedings effortlessly on piano, treated us to a mix of songs, various passages including G&S, snippets, anecdotes, reminiscing and bad press! Opening with Sondheim's: *Gods of the theatre, smile on us* (The Frogs: A New Musical), the concert flowed on with: *Tell Me Pretty Maiden* (Florodora). *When a merry maiden marries* (Gondoliers). *The air is charged with amatory numbers* (Sorcerer...where Bruce will weave his magic with it again at the Former D'Oyly Carte Members performance: Together Again, 12th Aug, Harrogate). *Tis done! From across the pond we were treated to: Rodgers and Hart: *Mountain Greenery* (The Garrick Gaieties); Gershwin: *But Not for Me* (Crazy Girl); Porter: *Just One Of Those Things* (Jubilee); Sondheim: *Anyone Can Whistle* (titular musical). Ending with audience participation, we all went home singing *When a felon's not engaged* (Pirates of Penzance). I bet you're all singing it now. Fantastic fun! Oh, and we did find out how Caroline tricked Bruce in The Gondoliers by putting a big weight in a carrier bag (basket)!
